Call to order: President Roger Walker called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance Walker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

New Business:

1. Discussion and action on an Ordinance Authorizing the Village of Lovington of Moultrie County Illinois to Borrow Funds from the Public Water Supply Loan Program

Mr. Hanfland with the Farnsworth Group explained about the Ordinance that the EPA requires that we pass for the Public Water Supply Program. He will let us know what needs to be published in the newspaper.

Discussion and action on an Ordinance amending Section 38-3-79 – Water Rates to Chapter 38 –
Utilities, Article III – Water System of the revised Code of Ordinances of the Village of
Lovington, Illinois

Walker explained about the need for the ordinance with the water increase as well as a 1% annual increase on the water rates.

A Motion was made by Anklam and seconded by Wood to approve the Ordinance amending Section 38-3-79 – Water Rates to Chapter 38 – Utilities, Article III – Water System of the revised Code of Ordinances of the Village of Lovington, Illinois which increases the minimum water rates by \$6.87 as well as increase the water rates by 1% annually. The 1% increase takes effect January 2020. Ordinance No. 2019-02

Walker stated that part of the money given by Lovington Homes to the Village was to purchase a truck for the water department. After purchasing the truck for the water department then the current truck will be passed down to the Building and Grounds (B&G) department and the B&G truck will be parked.

A Motion was made by Clem and seconded by Anklam to approve the purchase of a truck for the water department from Jackson Family of Dealerships for the amount of \$23,895.00

2. Discussion and action on employee health insurance

Daily reported that she spoke to Danny our insurance agent. When she told him, she needed something in writing regarding the need for us to have our employees pay part of their insurance so that if an employee refused our insurance, they would be able to. He called Blue Cross and was told that the medical insurance isn't affected at all by that ruling but life insurance is. So, there is no need to require the employees to pay for part of their insurance.

Walker asked if Jeremey Doggett or Roland Birt wanted to say anything. Jeremey reported that he has his truck (the water department truck) at Hammond getting some work done. (There is no heat in the truck.) This is the first time that it has needed work done on it.

Daily asked Roland Birt what class he attended last; his answer was that he is covered for the next 3 years.
