Wood reported on the following: The two Village workers are doing a great job. She will prepare a spreadsheet to keep track of how many hours Chris Gillis is working at the sewer and water plant. Also, Trustee Rennert will keep track of the classes Gillis is taking for Water Certifications.

Wood was asked if Garage sales would be held this summer. The health department said they can't stop us from the having a garage sale.

Town clean-up will be June 6, IV Container will a roll off a week before and trucks – need 12 volunteers. The volunteers will need to be at the old grocery store parking lot at 6:30 am. We will provide masks for the workers. Daily mentioned that Corvid 19 does stay on plastic for 2 to 3 days. She is concerned about the workers that are picking up the cleanup – she suggested having roll offs from 6:00 – noon on a Saturday and people would need to bring to the roll off. Garmon agrees with Daily. After much discussion the consensus was to not have the town wide clean up but to have roll offs where people can bring the items to it. Wood will check with IV Container on it.

Still planning on park recreation 9:30 to noon Aug. 3-7 after much discussion it was determined that we park recreation should be canceled for this summer per the Illinois Municipal League's recommendation per Governor's "Restore Illinois Plan".
