# Water and Sewer Report - Al Rennert

Rennert reported that we need a policy regarding damage to our meters – do we eat the cost or charge the person that does the damage? Rennert suggested that the home owner needs to place a flag by the water meters before snow is removed from their property and that we eat the first-time damage and if it is done again, the person doing the damage will be charged.

## Park and Special Projects – Todd Hale

Hale reported - Easter Egg hunt will be this year with masks being required as well as any other guidelines. The hunt will be Saturday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> They are requesting \$500.00 for the hunt.

Over the weekend - all of the lights in the park pavilion have been broken as well as picnic tables damaged. Discussion of cameras in the park that are backed up here at the police department. Hale is going to continue looking into which is best.

It was also suggested we change over the trash cans. He will look into new spring riders in the park. Saturday while he was at the park, he noticed glass was broken on the basketball court.

#### Police – Dennis Garmon

Garmon reported - DVR in both squad cars, are not working properly the cost will be \$157 for each of them. Last week the second squad car had new tires installed. There is a bill in the Illinois house that mandates that each of the policemen wear a body camera. Chief Swisher is looking at what needs to be purchased.

# Streets and Alleys - Curt Clough

Clough reported - On S Broadway there was a double wide house trailer that was torn down and piled by the alley. Some of it has been hauled off and the rest needs to continue to be hauled off.

There was a complaint of an alley that needed to be smoothed. Clough and Gillis went down each alley and they are in bad shape. To get them into shape - 12 ton of rock per alley is needed; some more some less at a cost of \$209 per alley – there are 35 alleys. There are bushes that need to be trimmed in the alleys. \$6897 to do all the alleys in town. There was some discussion of garbage trucks going down the alley causing some of the damage.
